Greetings Kentucky! By this time, I hope you all have had the opportunity to take at least one ride. April was a pretty busy month for me highlighted by the opportunity to ride with 3 different chapters. I was able to join Chapter A for a ride after their gathering to Hoggy's in Frankfort, and Chapter S for a ride to Taylorsville Lake State Park, where they had a picnic and then held their gathering. The 3rd chapter ride was with Chapter G (my home chapter) for their weekly ice cream ride. I have said many times that visiting other chapters is a great way to get in a ride and spend time with friends from all over the state, which is something I really enjoy.

. I began reflecting, while riding the backroads in unfamiliar territory, on my first ice cream rides with Chapter G back in 2005. Not being from the area, I was completely lost and only knew the names of the roads we were on by looking at my GPS. I was asked many times over the radio if I knew where I was, and I'd reply that my GPS says I'm ----- . Anyhow, the sense of nostalgia brought back so many great memories, not only of the rides, but of the people on them with me. This reminded me of just how much the organization has meant to me, and how much I have grown as a rider over the years. Prior to joining this group, the longest ride I had ever taken was from Fort Knox to Dayton, Ohio to show my parents the new bike I had bought myself as a retirement present from the Army. It was a 2001 Honda Shadow 750 A.C.E. I thought I had conquered the world making that 6-hour round trip! The purchase of my first Goldwing led a friend to invite me on these Wednesday evening rides that a group hosted. It was after my second or third ride that I was informed that this group was part of a larger organization, and they had meetings on the second Tuesday of every month. I was intrigued and started attending meetings, where I heard stories of traveling all over the place on a bike. I was hooked and eventually was able to convince Leah to join me. I couldn't wait to travel with this group, and our first trip was a weekend ride to Fall Creek Falls, Tennessee. The stops along the way, the meals shared, and the evenings at the hotel were amazing and the hook was set.

The same buddy that introduced me to Chapter G, also introduced me to the Iron Butt Association, where I learned about the Saddlesore 1000, and I knew it was something I had to do. A Saddlesore 1000 is riding 1000 miles in less than 24 hours. I planned my trip as a solo ride, because I wasn't sure I would be able to do it, and didn't want any witnesses if I were to fail. The night before my ride, I looked at my bike and said that after tomorrow, I am either going to love you or hate you! I made it and realized that I wanted even more. That brought on the Master Traveler Award, which is visiting 50 National Parks, or National Historic sites in 25 different states in less than a year. I earned the award by visiting 85 sites in 28 states. Since then, I have ridden in 41 of the 48 states, many of which have been on solo rides. So why am I telling you all this? First off, there is no way I would have ever dreamed of making any of the trips required had it not been for the encouragement I got by listening to the riding stories from my new friends. Second, it is my way of saying that I can't put a price tag on the value that my membership in the organization has given me.

## State Educators Report

This month we are planning a training on May 30, 2026, at the Indian / KTM dealer in Walton, KY.

I am hoping that there is a large interest in this training, such that we fill the class and have enough inquiries to force a second (or third) training date to be made. I have heard several, and can think of other, reasons why many do not want to participate in the various training being offered, especially the on-bike courses. I would like to explain why I believe the same reasons people express not to participate are in actuality the reasons why they should embrace the training.

Training courses that practice basic skill sets are a form of rote learning. Wikipedia gives us the following definition: “Rote learning is a memorization technique based on repetition. The method rests on the premise that the recall of repeated material becomes faster the more one repeats it.” It is true that the on-bike training courses in which I have participated have all basically, if not completely, utilized the same exercises in every instance. This is probably the same experience that you have had. And in fact, the training course being planned for May 30 will indeed use the same exercises as in the past from the “Sunny-side Up” course. Repeating the same training exercises is an example of rote learning. It is meant to reinforce what was learned in the past and potentially what may have been forgotten since the last training experience.

In school, rote learning was used for things like multiplication and division, verb tenses, spelling, and such. It was usually associated with a test, usually in written form, which gave students a goal to achieve and the means to measure their success. Motorcycle training exercises in a controlled environment are a form of rote learning which I believe to be important. I understand that practicing on a closed course, especially when people are watching, can feel like a test but I would suggest that people are always watching every move we make when we are out riding. This means that every day we ride, we take a test. During the training day, you may be pulled aside and offered some advice or constructive criticism, but there will be no formal test. Normally, nothing serious will happen and everyone will be dismissed to go home. During a ride, like a commute to work, or for ice cream, or wherever, there (hopefully) will be no one to pull you aside if you make a small mistake or otherwise not perform your best. But I argue that every ride is a test, with a pass or fail score. And when you make it to the end of that ride, you know the score.

One other thing that participating in on-bike training on a regular basis will provide is a consistent set of experiences you can use for comparison. I would suggest that many riders, including me, are not realistically able to compare and properly evaluate their day-to-day riding. This is because every ride has constantly changing variables that make it unique from any other ride. An on-bike training course that uses the same exercises on the same measured course has only one real variable – you. Any difference you notice, or the trainer/observer advises, is because of you. For me, this is valuable information that I can use to evaluate my ability to continue to ride and do so safely.

## State Ride Coordinators

No matter how meticulously you attempt to plan your ride, things can and will happen. Wrong turns can occur; roads and bridges may be closed with no detours. Restaurants can be closed unexpectedly or to full to accommodate the 10+ you may be traveling with for the meal. An unexpected breakdown may occur mid ride. Or worse, tragedy may occur in the form of an accident requiring our reliance on training. All of these events require the ride captain to be able to pivot from “what was planned” to “what do we need to do now”.

This requires the full cooperation from every person on the ride, from making suggestions, to being patient till an outcome is reached, to falling on that long ago training that was given and reinforced multiple times becoming muscle memory and everyone “doing their part” and becoming that well-oiled machine.

The riding season is in full swing and it’s time to review your training. Are you and your co-rider current in CPR/First Aid? Have you had recent on bike training course? Classes are scheduled for May 30 in Walton, KY. Have you reviewed emergency procedures in the case of an incident while on the road? What about reviewing emergency equipment? How fast can you find your first aid kit? What about your fire extinguisher? I know, we have all been thru this several times before but you can NEVER have enough training. Emergency procedures should be muscle memory.



## Don’t Forget the T-CLOCS

**T - Tires and Wheels:** Check pressure, tread, wear, and bearings.

**C - Controls:** Inspect levers, pedals, cables, and throttle for smooth operation.

**L - Lights and Electrics:** Verify headlights, signals, and brake lights work properly.

**O - Oil and Other Fluids:** Check levels of engine oil, brake fluid, and coolant.

**C - Chassis and Chain:** Inspect frame, suspension, and chain tension/lubrication.

**S - Stands:** Ensure side stand and center stand are secure.

## State Pins and Patches

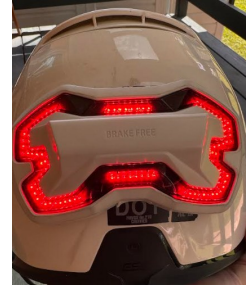

I spoke to Chapter G about this at their last meeting and I wanted to let you all know because I think it's important.

It fits on your helmet and it's totally wireless, has a built in accelerometer, so it lights up when you slow down. It's also rechargeable, using a standard USB-C connector.



If you ride solo; just snap it on your helmet. If you have a co-rider, it can snap on their helmet with the supplied 2nd mount .



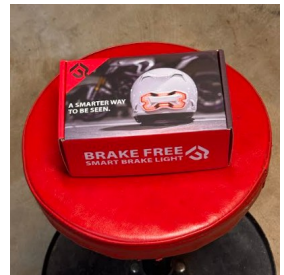
Every time you turn it on, the lights flash to indicate change status.

It's available in both white and black; mailed to you in a box.

Currently the price is \$159 and the company is Brakefree.com

Since it mounts on your helmet, not your bike, it's a LOT more visible to that distracted driver behind you!

## Around the World in Kentucky

Welcome to the 2026 State-wide Challenge – KRR Around the World in Kentucky! It is simple to play and hopefully includes something for everyone. Everyone who wants to participate will receive a location list of 29 Kentucky cities. Each of these cities correspond to one in another country – the countries are also included on the list. The objective of the Challenge is to visit each city and snap a picture. The specific address for the location to visit is also provided on the list. In almost all instances, it is the local post office. For those few cities that do not have a post office, an alternative location has been picked and the address for those places are included on the list. Once you reach the indicated address, simply snap a pic with your face and thumb up in front of the designated building. While this is intended to be a riding Challenge, we recognize that, for a variety of reasons, some of our KRR friends will not be riding this season or at least not as much. Therefore, please feel free to complete some or all of the Challenge in your automobile.

Once you have collected all 29 pics, email those to [mepc@kyroadriders.org](mailto:mepc@kyroadriders.org). If the image files are too large for a single email, feel free to send in multiple messages. Just be sure to notate the city number or numbers in the subject of each message – i.e. KRR Around the World in Kentucky Challenge - #5-#11.

The Challenge will run from the Winter Warm Up (January 30th & 31st) until midnight Saturday, August 8th. The winner will be randomly selected from all completed entries received by that date and be announced at the Blast at General Butler State Park August 13-15. Compete to win a sweet prize – a \$50 gift card – but more importantly for bragging rights. We had a good bit of participation in 2025 and are hoping for even more this year! The Challenge List will be available on the KRR Website, on the KRR Facebook Page and via email from [mepc@kyroadriders.org](mailto:mepc@kyroadriders.org). Additionally, hardcopies will be available at the Winter Warm Up and from your Chapter MEPC.

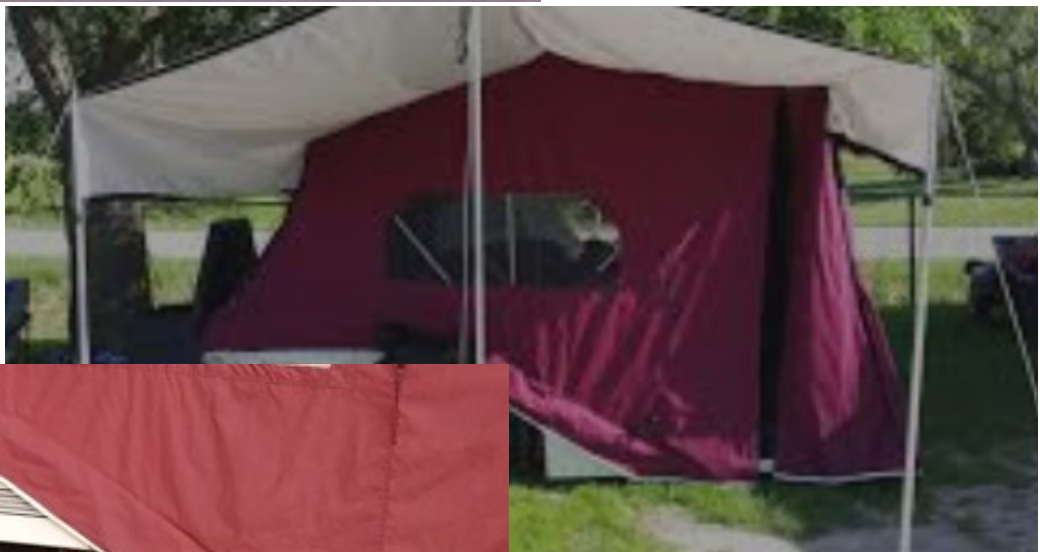
