View From The Saddle



It's raining...again...This is a common event in Kentucky and the amount of rain we get here is pretty surprising. I looked it up once and the annual rainfall in Paducah is less than an inch of what falls in Houston, TX. We try not to ride in the rain but, from time to time, we get caught in it and need a good rain suit to stay dry. Has anyone really looked at the rain suit Harley Davidson sells? It is a high quality item with black and orange colors, of course, and Harley Davidson proudly displayed on it.

I suggested to the Home Office once that GWRRA do something similar. I believe that if GW would find a superior rain suit with GWRRA on it that many, if not most, Gold Wing riders would buy it. I've looked at what GW is selling now as a rain suit and, honestly, it reminds me of black trash bags. Besides being attractive, a rain suit should be a high visibility color so we can be seen on those dark, rainy days. And add some reflective stripes somewhere that can be seen while you're sitting on the bike. While we're at it, make the GWRRA reflective. But not a black rain suit, for goodness sake.

I like a rain suit that has pants with no zipper. Just pull them on. And having suspenders helps keep them in place. The jacket should be zippered with storm flaps to keep driving rain from coming thru. A thin hood folded in to a tall collar would be handy. If you don't want to put the hood on under your helmet the tall collar tucked under the helmet keeps the water running off your helmet from traveling down your back. And if the collar would zip up high under your chin, that would help keep your front dry, although, I believe no rain suit will keep you 100% dry all of the time.

We had a chance to catch up with Chapter K eating lunch in Princeton on one of their rides. It was nice to meet these folks and we look forward to getting together with them again. "You meet the nicest people on a Honda."

As we get in to riding season in earnest, remember to check the bike over after it's been sitting most of the winter. Tire pressures vary as the weather warms up or cools off. Get down and really examine the tire tread to make sure there's plenty of tread left and no unusual signs of wear or damage. How old is that battery? Mine is the original that came with the bike in 2018 so I'm planning on replacing it next year when it's 5 years old. Some may think I'm pushing it but I've never had a battery fail that was less than 5 years old. But I keep it on a Battery Tender all winter, which I believe helps the battery life. Still, bike batteries can die with no warning so if your battery is over 5 years old it's time to think about replacing it.

After you've check the bike out and it's ready to go, do just that...GO... It's riding season!

Signs, signs, everywhere are signs! When I ride, this catchy tune often pops in my head. While you may disagree with the message in the song written by Les Emmerson of the Five Man Electrical Band, it is true there are many different types of signs posted along our highways, all designed to provide information about traffic and highway conditions ahead. In the early days of motor vehicles, there were no standards, and no road markings either. In 1911, the first center line was painted on a road in Cleveland. In 1915, the first STOP sign was planted in Detroit, followed five years later by the first three color traffic light, also in Detroit.

Today we have the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices, or MUTCD, that sets a minimum standard for all highway signs so that everyone can better understand the information they offer. First issued on November 7, 1935, this manual defines the meaning behind each shape and color of the signs in use. And it is reviewed and amended as needed at regular intervals.

The color of roadway signs is an important indicator of the information they contain. Each color is also defined with a pantone number for uniformity. The use of red (187) on signs is limited to stop, yield, and actions that are prohibited like NO PARKING. A white background indicates a regulatory sign, such as speed limit signs. Red and white signs indicate laws applicable to that section of highway. Yellow (116) conveys a general warning message, such as signs posted to indicate curvy roads or pavement that may be slippery when wet. Green (342) shows permitted traffic movements or directional guidance. These are commonly seen along our interstate highways indicating exits and travel lane details. Fluorescent yellow/green (382) indicates pedestrian crossings and school zones. Orange (152) is used for warning and guidance in construction zones, and like regulatory signs, indicate laws that are required to be observed. Coral (198), a pink color, is used for incident management signs. Blue (294) indicates road user services like rest areas and handicapped parking, tourist information, and evacuation routes. And brown (469) is for guidance to sites of public recreation or cultural interest like parks and recreation areas.

The shape of a sign can also alert roadway users to the type of information displayed on a sign. Traffic regulations are conveyed in rectangular signs that are taller than they are wide, or square. Other shapes used for regulatory signs are octagons for stop and inverted triangles for yield. Diamond-shaped signs signify warnings. Rectangular signs that are wider than they are tall provide guidance information. Pentagons indicate school zones, and circular signs warn of railroad crossings.

Richard also added: "If you are out and riding, be sure to check the tire pressures every day. A 40 degree Fahrenheit change in temperature will result in a 4 PSI change in your tire pressure. Low pressures result in increased wear and potential failure."
