Riding season is here. For many of us here in Kentucky, we ride to some degree all year long. You have to pick your days thru the winter months, for sure, but 60 degree days are not uncommon during our winters. It usually comes with wind, but I learned, after living many years in the Panhandle of Nebraska, that if you don't ride in the wind, you don't ride.

But riding infrequently does let your skills get a little rusty; not to mention being another year older. So it's important to get some practice time in to knock that rust off. I like to hit a parking lot somewhere on my spring rides and make some tight turns and maybe an emergency stop to remind myself about what it takes to be a proficient motorcycle rider. That doesn't replace taking an Advanced Rider Course, but it's better than nothing. The time to remember how to make an emergency stop is not during an emergency. You have to develop the muscle memory to make a coordinated and effective stop before that car (deer, dog, etc, you fill in the blank) jumps out in front of you.

With the real riding season underway, Chapter Y made a trip to Greenville, TN to have a burger at Wimpy's Corner last Saturday. There was a good turnout with a total of 9 bikes, 11 riders and a Jeep with a couple of folks. Dan took us "the back way", which he usually does, which started with a tour, for those who hadn't seen it already, of the devastation of the December 10 tornado in downtown Mayfield. District Educator Report

May is Motorist Awareness Month. This month I would like to share an article from Bruce Luhrs, the NH-VT District Educator. It is a first-hand account of something we all face every day. It is reproduced in its entirety below with his permission.

“They Looked but Failed to See” The mission of the GWRRA Motorist Awareness Program is “To Facilitate A Reduction in Motorcycle Accidents through the Education of the Non-Motorcycle Riding Public”. For Motorist Awareness Month, I’d like to share information about the most common type of car-motorcycle accident classified as a looked-but-failed-to-see crash. While on a ride last Fall, I collided with a driver who made a left-hand turn in front-of me into his driveway. He appeared to have stopped to let me pass, but at the last

minute turned into me. I was wearing a high-vis jacket, a full-face helmet with high-vis markings and riding my GL1800 Gold Wing with the headlight on. We were the only two vehicles on a long stretch of straight road. The driver said, “he never saw me”. Because we believe in the GWRRA’s safety mantras - ATGATT and Rider Education, I avoided serious injuries. My wife, Sue, was baffled by the fact that “he never saw me” and spent some time researching why these types of collisions are so common. There is a very real psychological phenomenon causing this. Inattentional Blindness is defined as “a person is missing critical information even when their eyes are focused on the road ahead”. There are two contributing factors:

- It can happen when you are very focused on only one thing while driving. For example, if you become hyper-focused on reaching an exit or turning into a driveway, you can miss other things happening around you on the road.
- Inattentional Blindness is also called Perceptual Blindness. Our brains cannot process every detail of our surroundings all the time, so it concentrates on what is expected to be in our surroundings. In other words, people do not always see new and unexpected things that suddenly appear within their visual field – like motorcycles!

As many as 92% of households do not own a motorcycle. So, we are a rare group of 8%. Plus, we do not ride all the time, especially here in the Northeast when riding is seasonal. People do not expect to see us! There are a couple ways we can combat this dilemma – ride more and promote Motorist Awareness by displaying Check Twice – Save a Life ©, Motorcycles are Everywhere bumper stickers. Sue and I will be in touch with each of the NH-VT District’s Chapter Directors to discuss our plans to distribute some bumper stickers. These purchased from Paul Cote at <http://www.checktwice-savealife.com/> whose mission is to help raise awareness of drivers sharing the road with motorcycles by displaying bumper stickers, signs and other products aimed at reducing motorcycle accidents, injuries, and fatalities. While thanking Sue for our order, Paul also thanked GWRRA members for promoting motorcycle safety awareness aimed at reducing accidents and injuries, and all the positive reflections the owners of Gold Wings generate in the riding community.


