View From The Saddle



I learned something the other day. It was time for an oil change on my 1982 Honda Trail 110 and the book calls for the cover on the right side of the engine to be removed. This involves removing the kick starter, removing multiple screws and breaking the engine apart. Having not done this for several years, I'd forgotten that many of the clutch parts fall to the ground when the bike is on the center stand. No big deal, I have the manual to show me how things go back together and leaning the bike over will hold things in place.

What I learned, however, is that you should NOT use a screwdriver and hammer to break the cover loose. Driving the screwdriver between the halves of the engine broke it free but also put a crease in the engine case. So, after buying and installing a new cover gasket, pulling the oil screen and inspecting it, I put it all back together and added oil. Next morning I had oil leaking out of the engine on to the cardboard I had under the bike. Well, @#%&, I thought. What could have gone wrong with the gasket? AND the seal around the kick starter was leaking, too! So, I ordered a replacement seal and after draining the oil out, I broke the cover loose and then saw the damage I had caused. Fortunately, the new gasket was fine. Now what??

I contacted Honda of Princeton, where I had purchased the gasket and ordered the kick starter seal, and was advised that I might be able to stop the leak with a Honda sealer. It was pretty expensive, especially considering that I planned to use less than a thimble full of the stuff. They said if they had an open tube they'd give me some but it dries up if not used fast enough and, understandably, they didn't want to open a tube just to make me happy. But they did suggest an alternative: Permatex Ultra Grey gasket sealer. I found it on Amazon and had it the next day. After the kick starter seal arrived I went back to work. After a thorough cleaning of the surface of the case I had mistreated, I used a very small amount of the Permatex and reassembled following all of the directions on the tube to a "T". Then I carefully pushed the new kick starter seal over the splines and tapped it in to place. Now, just wait 24 hours and refill it with oil.

Next day I replaced the oil and after passing the "sit and wait test", I took it for a spin and then let it sit a while as the final test. HEY! It's not leaking! Success. The trail bike is good to go. But I will NOT go thru that again. The oil screen was very clean even after too long between oil changes and, according to the guys at Princeton Honda, they rarely see anything on these screens. Here's what else I learned: Next time, change the oil and call it good. And I gave the Permatex to the Princeton shop hoping they could use it before it dries out. I don't plan to use it again!

This is very typical of how it goes when I play mechanic. Thank goodness I'm a better rider than mechanic. Otherwise I'd be riding by myself a lot!

When we ride in groups, especially if we have riders that are unknown to the group, and they do not know our group, we need to be communicating with each other while on the road. For this purpose, the CB radio is a great tool, but only one person at a time can convey information. However, common hand signals can be used by everyone at any time and can be a faster way to relay important information. <http://www.michaelpadway.com/wp-content/uploads/2013/12/motorcycle-hand-gestures-chart.jpg>

Speed Up Inexperienced groups will benefit most from this signal. Experienced groups rely more on body language. Use it to tell the rest of the group to match your pace by increasing their speed. Extend your arm and swing your palm in an upward direction to give the signal.



Slow Down This signal is useful because motorcycles generate intense engine-braking forces, which do not activate the rear-facing brake light. Extend your arm and swing your palm down toward the road to tell everyone in the group to slow down.



Follow Me Used to announce a new, often self-appointed group leader. Also used to segment a large group into a smaller group. Make the signal by extending your arm forward at the shoulder with your palm facing outward.



You Lead/Come AKA the "YOU! Follow me!" signal. It has 2 distinct parts. Start by pulling up alongside the rider you want to follow or lead. In one motion, point to their bike and then swing your arm forward. Repeat this motion until the other rider understands.



Road Hazard This is a "2 in 1" signal. The signal is different depending on whether the hazard is to the right or the left. If the hazard is on the left, point with your left arm. Point with your right foot if the hazard is on the right.





Single File An easy gesture. Extend your left index finger and bend your arm up to the sky. In other words, pretend the riders behind you are asking “How many?” and then indicate the answer by gesturing with your *left pointer finger*.



Double File Bend your left arm at the elbow and point to the sky with your index and middle fingers. Do not forget to include your index finger.



Turn Signal On To make a “blinking” gesture using your left hand, alternate between extending your fingers and making a fist. Use this signal to let another rider know he left his blinker on, allowing him to save face during the next comfort or refreshment stop.



Pull Off Indicate to the rest of the group to pull off of the highway, either immediately or at the next exit. The pull off signal is given when the reason for the stop is something other than a comfort or refreshment stop.



Fuel When riding with most groups, running out of gas will earn you a nickname you probably won’t like. Communicate your need to refuel by pointing to your fuel tank using your left index finger

Please be courteous to your fellow riders, and signal important points as necessary. Also, when another rider signals, be sure to pass it back for everyone else.


